John Betjeman (1906-1984) was among the pre-eminent poets of the twentieth century, enthusing people about Britain's cities, landscape and architecture. He campaigned to save many notable buildings including the magnificent St Pancras Station. He was an admirer of the work of G F Bodley. The Betjeman Society is committed to keeping his legacy alive.
